Between

The University of Houston,
Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management**

This agreement is entered into this 8th day of August 2008, by and between the District Board of Trustees of Hillsborough Community College (HCC) and the Board of Trustees of the University of Houston.

WHEAREAS, HCC and the University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management desire to coordinate curricula so that students may move easily from the last courses in a sequence to the next course in a program at The University of Houston, Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management.

WHEAREAS, HCC and the The University of Houston, Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management desire the effective use of their resources to provide those seeking higher education with a wider ranger of options in achieving their educational needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree to cooperate in articulating programs so students may take full advantage of educational opportunities best suited to their individual needs.

For HCC graduates with an Associates of Science or Associate of Applied Science in the specific programs with a GPA of 2.75 or better during the period of this agreement, University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management will agree to the following:

A. HCC students who have earned an Associate in Science Degree are eligible for a direct transfer to and enter the University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management. HCC students who have earned an Associate in Science or Associate in Applied Science in the specified programs are eligible for direct transfer in accordance with the courses articulated between both institutions, given that they earned a grade of C or better in each course. HCC students seeking admission to University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management without an AS degree or from other AS/AAS programs will be treated in accordance with regular University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management policy for transfer students. The granting of credit will be determined by an evaluation of each course.




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
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- B. Transferring HCC students will follow the University of Houston's Undergraduate Studies catalog for enrollment procedures, residency, and graduation purposes.
- C. A maximum of 66 semester hours of lower division (freshman and sophomore) transfer work will be allowed to apply toward a baccalaureate degree at the University of Houston. It is understood that students must fulfill the University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management prerequisites for junior and senior level courses.
- D. The Articulation Agreement between HCC and University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management will be publicized among the faculty, students and in the HCC college catalog.
- E. The recommended general education requirements of University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management and the course equivalents list will be made available to faculty members, counselors, and students at HCC.
- F. HCC will allow the University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management to offer classes not available on the HCC campus as needed to accommodate student desires. HCC will provide classroom space and instructional equipment. University of Houston's Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management will provide the instructors.


THIS AGREEMENT shall be continued from the date first shown on page one of this Agreement. Both parties shall meet for a review of this agreement as necessary after its inception. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party, provided the termination shall not become effective until after the current term has been completed.


